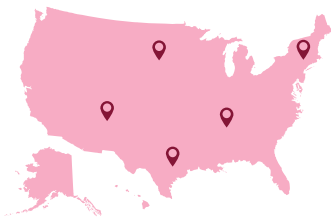

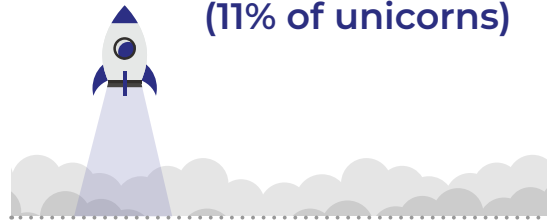
The impact of Indian diaspora in the US: From leadership to economic growth

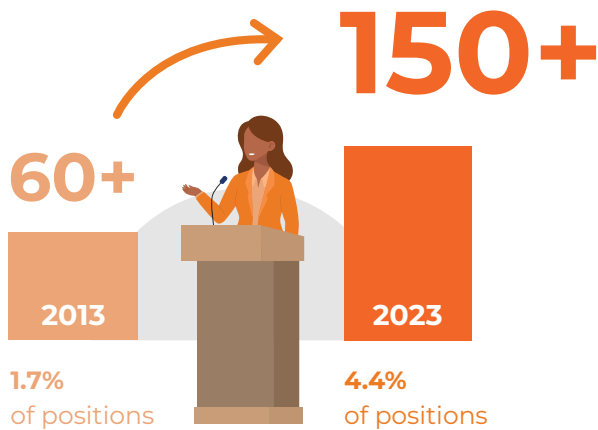
